This policy outlines the commitment that Play Action International has to ethical travel and the initiatives and procedures that are taken to ensure this commitment is a reality.

# **Protecting Our Planet**

There is an urgent need for all organisations to work in an environmentally responsible and sustainable manner to ensure we can protect the most incredible playground imaginable... planet Earth itself! When it comes to the student fundraising sector, we are proud to say that with the support of our volunteers, staff, and suppliers, Play Action International is leading the way.

### 1. Carbon Neutral Flights

We invest in carefully chosen environmental projects in Uganda to offset the entire carbon footprint of your flight to Uganda and thus neutralise the impact of your air travel. Feel great before you even land in Uganda knowing that your flight is carbon neutral.

### 2. Riverbank Conservation

With our base in Uganda located on the banks of the awe-inspiring River Nile in Jinja, we are committed to supporting our local riverbank restoration project which includes communityled planting of indigenous trees on the riverbank, riverbank beekeeping for alternative income, and sensitisation/support to riverbank landowners to ensure the protection of this critical eco-system.

### 3. Reducing Plastic

At PAI we are concerned about the amount of plastic that is currently entering our ecosystems. As a child based organisation, we want children to have the best life possible, and providing them with a clean environment for them to play in now and for generations to come is part of that. Not only do we work closely with our local activity suppliers and subcontractors to reduce the use of single-use plastics, we have also started a plastic recycling project, where we will use plastic which is collected from Jinja and surrounding areas and process this plastic to be incorporated into our playgrounds. This creates a circular economy providing income whilst also protecting the environment. Currently we collect and process around 30 tonnes of plastic each month, meaning that's 30 less tonnes of plastic in the local environment!

From using FSC certified printers for things like flyers, to recycling old truck tyres for our playgrounds, we are passionate about finding as many ways as possible to lead the way in reducing the environmental impact of international development projects.

## **Respecting Communities**

Play Action International works in partnership with each community, ensuring their wishes and requests are respected. Each playground and programme that we deliver has been requested by that community. From there, we work together to design a programme that suits the desires of that

specific community. This is done through multiple community consultations which include everyone from the elders to the children themselves.

Throughout our volunteering programmes we ensure that there is constant open dialog between the members of the community and our local organisation, enabling us to identify and issues, big or small, and work together to resolve them.

Prior to a volunteering programme taking place, we provide information sessions for the community members about what they might expect from hosting a group of volunteers. We cover everything from cultural differences to customs and taste in food. There sessions allow broad conversations and debate to help understand possible differences.

## **Responsible Volunteering**

Play Action International is committed to ensuring our volunteer placements are created responsibly and that our volunteers act in a responsible manner, being given the information and guidance needed to do so.

Volunteers are provided training in a broad spectrum of topics that can help them to understand their role and how to carry out this role responsibly. Play Action International takes the acts of the volunteers very seriously and whilst on project, the group leaders are there to help guide the volunteers in making sure their behaviour is always appropriate.

## Equal Opportunities

Play Action International recognise that everyone has a contribution to make to our society and a right to equal opportunities. Here are the steps we take to ensure this...

- 1. We create an environment in which individual differences and the contributions of all our staff, volunteers and beneficiaries are recognised and valued.
- 2. We ensure that every employee, volunteer, and beneficiary is entitled to be part of an environment that promotes dignity and respect to all. No form of intimidation, bullying or harassment will be tolerated.
- 3. We make sure that training, development, and progression opportunities are available to all staff and volunteers.
- 4. Equality is good management practice and makes sound sense. We are strict in ensuring that any breaches of our equality policy are regarded as misconduct and therefore could lead to disciplinary proceedings or disqualification.

We believe that our opportunities are open to everyone, and so we work to provide equal representation, cultural understanding, and an adaptive manner of working to ensure we are inclusive to all. Each time we work with our volunteers, we take a personal approach to ensure that support them in a way which enables them to gain the full experience of our volunteering project whilst also having a hugely positive impact on children in Uganda.





## Animal Welfare

Play Action International has a commitment to animal welfare, and we ensure that any activity we promote has an equal commitment to animal welfare. We encourage volunteers to go on safari to contribute to the protection of the wildlife through the Murchison Falls National Park and Ziwa Rhino Sanctuary's entry fees. Volunteers also stay at Ugandan Wildlife Education Centre, a place that is dedicated to the education of protecting wildlife.

### **Economic Impact**

Play Action International volunteering experiences are designed to economically benefit the destination of travel. We work to make sure that our activity and material providers are based in Uganda wherever possible and that we promote the country as a positive place to travel to. Below are some of the ways we are committed to supporting the local economy:

- 1. We do not take any material donations from the UK that we can purchase from Uganda.
- 2. Our team is made up from majority local people that fit all types of roles.
- 3. 99% of the materials we use to construct the playgrounds and run our different programmes are all sourced locally to ensure a local economic benefit.
- 4. The partners we work with are based in East Africa and adhere to ethical travel policies.
- 5. We promote local tourism and encourage volunteers to spend locally when in country.
